Findmypast - Get a free DNA test when you subscribe to Findmypast UK ONLY

Findmypast.co.uk are currently offering a free DNA test (normal price £79 plus delivery) to new subscribers in the UK. To qualify you need to purchase a 12 month Plus or Pro subscription. No closing date has been given, however on the website it does described the offer as "for a limited time". Search online for findmypast subscription

**Ancestry.co.uk - New records -** Pembrokeshire, Wales, Electoral Registers, 1740-1978. This database contains yearly registers listing names and residences of people in Pembrokeshire who were eligible to vote in elections. These year-by-year registers can help place your ancestors in a particular place and possibly also reveal a bit about property they owned.

Also UK and Ireland, Find A Grave Index, 1300s-Current. This database contains an index to cemetery and burial details posted on Find A Grave. Find A Grave provides users a virtual cemetery experience, with images of grave markers from around the world, as well as photos, biographies, and other details uploaded by volunteers. You may find obituaries and links to other family members included as well.

**1605** William Dugdale, English genealogist and historian is born; As a scholar he was influential in the development of medieval history as an academic subject (d. 1686)

1609 Henry Hudson, English sea explorer, begins his exploration of the Hudson River while aboard the Halve Maen

**1846** Elizabeth Barrett, English poet popular in Britain and the United States during her lifetime, elopes with Robert Browning, English poet and playwright

1897 Irène Joliot-Curie, French chemist and physicist, Nobel Prize laureate is born (d. 1956)

**1906** The Newport Transporter Bridge is opened in Newport, South Wales by Viscount Tredegar; it is a grade I listed structure **1933** Physicist and inventor Leo Szilard, while waiting for a red light on Southampton Row in Bloomsbury, conceives the idea of
