**Elizabeth Barton of Aldington, The Holy Maid of Kent"
Speaker Melanie Gibson-Barton**

Born in 1506 in Aldington, Elizabeth Barton appears to have come from a poor background and was working for a farmer in her parish when she first claimed to have received divine revelations.

Her visions led to her being known as the Nun of Kent and the Maid of London. But why did this young visionary become so dangerous to Henry VIII and two of his wives, Anne Boleyn and Catherine of Aragon, that she had to be executed?

BROMLEY - 21st MARCH 2020 - Annual Meeting + Women at Sea - surviving in a man's world" - Speaker Eleanor Monk - Up until quite recently, women were by and large non-existent in maritime history. If women were mentioned, it was either because they were exceptional women in a man's world or they were incidental in the domestic lives of fishermen or seafarers. Among the thousands of shipwrecks recorded around the coast, are stories showing female involvement in wreck events. Women have taken on an active role at sea, including daring rescues and as shipboard nurses in the WWI. Eleanor joins us tonight to tell us more.

DARTFORD - 4th APRIL 2020

"Dartford Hospitals during World War 1" - Speaker Francine Payne - Dartford has an interesting mix of hospitals with an interesting history; and not all of them built for local people. During the Wars Dartford hospitals were used by American and Australian forces and the Lower Southern became a German POW hospital. This evening Francine tells us their story during WWI.

12TH MARCH - Annual Meeting + "Women and the Official War Artists' Scheme of WW1 and WW2"

British official war artists were a select group of artists employed to produce specific works, during WW1 and WW2, and select military actions in the post-war period. Appointed by governments for information or propaganda purposes and to record events on the battlefield. They will have depicted some aspect of war through art; this might be a pictorial record or it might commemorate how war shapes lives. They create a visual account of war by showing its impact as men and women are shown waiting, preparing, fighting, suffering and celebrating. They illustrate and record many aspects of war, and the individual's experience of war, whether allied or enemy, service or civilian, military or political, social or cultural.

Society of Genealogists Talk - Wednesday 1 April 14:00 - History of Kentish Town

Kentish Town is not where it should be! The original village was clustered around St Pancras Old Church, a mile or so further south. However, around the 13th century St Pancras village re-sited itself on the confluence of two branches of the River Fleet, known as 'the Ken Ditch'. Fine gentlemen's houses were built amid the fields but the village was snubbed again when St Pancras New Church was built in Euston Road. Various railway companies driving their tracks and goods yards through the area should have finished the village off. But Kentish Town has survived.

The National Archives and the Federation of Family History Societies (FFHS) are cooperating to improve the contents and accuracy of the Manorial Documents Register and make all of it accessible to the world at large.

Funding from The Federation has helped bring forward four additional county projects. As a result, Wiltshire and Northumberland are already completed and launched online. Work on Northamptonshire and Kent is currently in progress.

Manorial documents have huge potential for family and local historians because they contain information about the lives of ordinary people going back to a period when few other sources may be available. They also add richness and detail to the information researchers can obtain from parish registers and wills. We are therefore very pleased to support the revision of the register and improve access to these important records.

What are "Systematic" Indexes?

These are indexes that specify exactly which records are included and the timeframe covered. For example, "all the marriages between 1558 and 1837 in the parish register for the parish of Norton". Some indexes cover a very large range of records, such as those to national censuses or of all the marriages recorded in a particular county for a lengthy period.

This workshop will explain how to draw by hand a Family Group sheet (FGS) chart to understand the time line and relationships of a family. It will discuss the symbols and abbreviations used on charts and diagrams. Gaps on charts and re-occurring data may indicate trends that suggests future research needed. The workshop will also look at other types of charts including 'Drop Charts', 'Total Descent Charts', 'Birth Briefs' and 'Mind Maps'.
