MyHeritage - Temporary, Free Access to 1.3 billion Census and Electoral Roll Records

For the next week MyHeritage is offering free access to all census records it holds, from September 1 – 8, 2021.

The Census and Voter Lists category on MyHeritage encompasses a vast repository of over 1.3 billion records, including census records from the U.S., U.K., Ireland, Scandinavia, and Canada as well as electoral rolls and other records from Australia, Venezuela, Chile, Argentina, Armenia, Greece, and much more.

These records offer valuable snapshots of the lives of people living in these locations throughout history, especially from the 19th century onward.
