Today's headline photo has been sent in by Kate Holloway in Bexleyheath.

"It is the marriage of Annie TOLLADY and Arthur W PHILLIPS who married at St Paulinus Church in Crayford on the 26 Dec 1892.

Annie had come from Bury St Edmunds to teach at Slade Green School and appears on the 1891 census in that location. Arthur lived opposite the school in Elm Cottages.

Next to the bride is Mary Ann NEWMAN from Lydiard Millicent in Wiltshire, who married Arthur's brother Henry. Mary was in charge of Slade Green School. Behind the bride and groom are his parents, Arthur Phillips and Sarah (FITCH). The man with the impressive beard is Alfred, Annie's father.

Saturday 18 May Speaker at Bromley 10.30am Melanie Winterbotham will talk about Gretna Green, romance or remorse?

Couples have been fleeing to Scotland to marry in haste since the 18th century, but why?

In the mid 1700s English law tightened marriage arrangements. Couples had to be 21 before they could marry without their parents' consent and their marriage had to take place in a church.

But Scottish law allowed couples to marry on the spot, in a simple ceremony, merely requiring two witnesses and assurances from the couple that they were both free to marry.

Such a relaxed arrangement led to the inevitable influx of couples eloping to marry over the border. Gretna Green was the first village they would come to in Scotland and conveniently situated on the main route from London.

Did any of your ancestors have a runaway marriage?

Mark Twain said "*If you don't read the newspaper, you're uninformed. If you read the newspaper, you're misinformed.*" You could apply this to family history documents. This workshop will give you the tools to try to avoid coincidences of names and researching someone else's family as yours.

This started her on a treasure hunt, spending many hours at the Archives going through just some of the historical documents. The feeling of holding handwritten documents dating back to the 1700s was amazing. She looks forward to sharing some of her findings with us.
