A photo postcard of Thomas Walter Humphrey **LLOYD** aged 7 months sent to Mrs C **BOTTEN** (Jessie Botten), Oakleigh Cottage (The Heath) Horsmonden, Kent dated 4 May 1907. (Horsmonden is a village within the borough of Tunbridge Wells).

Today's photo is another taken from the extensive collection on our Flickr pages.

Thank you to that thoughtful person who, over 100 years ago, wrote the baby's full name and age on the photo. Oh that all our ancestors were so helpful!

Thomas Walter Humphrey Lloyd, born 25 September 1906 was the son of Horace Arthur Lloyd

and Nellie Matilda WOODROFFE who had married 9 December 1905 at Haringey, Middlesex.

Nellie's mother's maiden name was MEDHURST.

Sadly, Nellie Matilda Lloyd died in 1909 when the second child of the marriage, Nellie Woodroffe Lloyd, was born, in Southgate, London.

The 1911 census shows the family living at 39 Natal Road, New Southgate, London.

On 6 April 1912 Horace Lloyd married his second wife, Emily Louise **WINGROVE** at St Gabriel, Bounds Green, Haringey.

Emily Wingrove was born in Edmonton in 1883 and her mother's maiden name was WILSON.

Mrs C. Botten was Jessie Botten the wife of Charles Botten (The postcard writer, Emily, had used the, to us very old fashioned style, of addressing a wife by her husband's name or initial). In 1911 Jessie is living with her children at The Warren, Horsmonden, Kent. Her son Charles Henry Botten served in the Buffs (East Kent Regiment) during WWI and died 11 February 1917 in Iraq.

Thursday 12 August 7pm for 7.30 Natalie Bodle My ancestors were Irish or were they?

Natalie is a full-time professional genealogist, educator and tour guide and am a member of the Association of Professional Genealogists (APG). A native of County Antrim, her company Roots Revealed is based in Ballymena, County Antrim, Northern Ireland.

The talk examines the history and origins of Irish surnames. If you don't know where in Ireland your ancestors originated, there will be tips to help you to narrow down the location. First names often followed a traditional naming pattern and this can help to build your family tree. There are some naming traditions that were used in particular by the Ulster Scots that again can help to expand your family tree and Latin names sometimes used in Roman Catholic records.
