Sevenoaks Branch April Talk: Who are the Travellers with Carol Mellors

Saturday 13 April Doors open 10.45am meeting starts 11am Otford Village Memorial Hall 28A High Street, Otford, Kent TN14 5PQ

Carol trained as a teacher and for 20 years was responsible for Traveller Education in West Kent.

When the Roma arrived from Eastern Europe in the early 2000s she worked to advise schools on the inclusion of newly arrived Roma who could not speak English and had not been accessing schools in Eastern Europe.

With her team of teachers and classroom assistants she set up projects to link English Gypsies with their distant cousins the Roma. She created culturally appropriate materials for schools and trained teachers, police, Health Service personnel and Social Services in how to liaise with communities.

She also worked with Irish Travellers, New Age Travellers and Circus and Fairground communities.

Her talk will include the background of travellers and how to identify and research them. She will also cover New Age and Irish Travellers, Circus and Fairground folk who are separate ethnic groups.

ZOOM Talk with David Cufley 24 April 7.30pm Greenwich Park Wall History 1609 - 2023

The bricks and brickwork of Greenwich Park Wall are normally not seen, as the viewer looks past and into the park and at its Observatory.

This talk explores the boundary wall and how it has been changed over its 400-year life. It discusses not only its construction and materials but also the buildings that were built onto or through it.

Built at the beginning of the 17th century, the wall is a listed building and its 1986 archaeological survey report says that '*no record of the source for the bricks has been found*".

The talk discusses the manufacture and laying of bricks in this period and seeks local brickmakers and their sites that may have contributed to its construction.
