Dave Annal: our first speaker of the day *My Ancestor was a Liar.*

Dave is a senior researcher and has more than 40 year experience as a family historian. A former Principal Family History Specialist at The National Archives he is an accomplished author and has given talks several times at "Who do You think You Are". He also gives talks at London Metropolitan Archives and many Family History Societies around London and the South East.

Using real examples, Dave will look at some of the reasons why our ancestors might have lied and offer suggestions on how to recognise their varying degrees of ignorance, half-truths and wilful deception

Alan Williams: our second speaker of the day Over – paid, Over- Sexed and Over- here. The American Invasion of Britain 1942-1945

Alan has only recently started to give talks to societies such as ours. Prior to retiring he was a lecturer in History and devotes much of his spare time supporting "The 1940's Society" in Otford.

In his talk today Alan will explore the "invasion" of American Service personnel and show a 1943 War Office film 'A Welcome to Britain' which explained to American servicemen and women how strange life in Britain was, from 'funny money' and driving on the wrong side of the road to warm beer.
