GRO Increase charges for Certificates & Digitised (PDF) Copies of birth and death records

Increased charges for this service, which will come into force on 16 February 2019 :-

- The cost of print certificates will increase from £9.25 to £11
- The cost of digitised PDF copies will increase from £6 to £7

In addition to these increased charges, two <u>new non-refundable fees</u> will be brought in at the same time.

- In exchange for GRO staff carrying out a search of the index the researcher will be charged £3
- where the GRO cannot fulfil an order because the staff cannot locate the record with the information provided the researcher will be charged £3.50

The increased fees are the first pricing changes at the GRO since 2010.

Members are reminded that the provision of PDF copies via the internet, which was originally introduced as a pilot scheme in October 2017 has now been extended indefinitely.

The GRO site offers free searchable online indexes for birth and death records in England and Wales as follows:-

Births: 1837-1916 Deaths: 1837-1957

Wherever possible the birth index includes the mother's maiden name even from the very earliest records in1837. The death records include the age at death even from the very earliest records in1837.

PROJECTS - Cudham Marriage Register 1837-1900

Cudham is a village in the London Borough of Bromley and we are **urgently seeking volunteers** to transcribe the hand written register entries for these marriages on to a standard spreadsheet.

David Cufley is running an EXCEL workshop at the Library on 30 January for those who are interested in learning the techniques required to assist with the backlog of work in the production of CDs and FMP material. This is a very important part of the Society's work and income, and requires as many people as possible to get involved. After David's workshop it will not require attendance at the library, everything is done on computer from home.

There is also an educational reward for the volunteer translaters as it gives an insight into the background of BMD records and how they are formed. This helps to make better informed choices when you are faced with a choice of commercial records for your ancestors.
