TO THE NEW WORLD



In September 1620, the ship Mayflower, finally left England from Plymouth, Devon, with most of those on board intending to settle in the New World. There were 102 passengers



on board, including 37 members of the Separatist Leiden congregation, who would go on to be known as the Pilgrims. The rest were non-separatist passengers, their servants & included 31 children. One child was born during the voyage & aptly named Oceanus. The crew was led by Captain Christopher Jones, who was born in Harwich. The total number of crew members is currently unknown.

November 2019 sees the start of a year of celebration & commemoration of this 400th anniversary. One project has already started, a website has been created, www.mayflower400uk.org which will tell you more about the celebrations, the history & the stories of the voyage. Of interests to family historians is a list of names of the passengers & their places of origin. This can be accessed by going to 'Stories of the Mayflower' & then 'Mayflower Passengers Interactive Guide' from the home page.

Does anyone on the list have the same surname as one in your family? If so can you link them into your family tree? Four hundred years is a long way to go back, but if you can, your ancestors could have the prestige of being one the founders of the USA.
