



Thank you to Sue Beacher who kindly sent in today's photo who writes: -

Please find attached a photo of 3 generations of my RELPH ancestors taken in 1917, just after the gentleman in the wheelchair was discharged from the army. He was Cpl Alfred George Relph born 23 June 1891, the uncle of the young boys.

He had enlisted in the Royal Garrison Artillery on 6 August 1909. The family lived in Greenwich and Deptford.

The two young boys at the front are, on the right, my granddad Alfred Robert BRUCE (1908-1999) and his older brother William Alfred Bruce born 1906 on the left.

In the back row standing on the right behind the boys is their mother Elizabeth Bruce nee Relph 1883-1956 (Alfred George's sister) and next to her are Elizabeth and Alfred George's parents Richard John Relph and Elizabeth Susannah Relph nee BARNABY.

Richard and Elizabeth had already lost another son in the Royal Garrison Artillery in India in 1915, his name was Gunner Herbert G Relph and he is commemorated on the Delhi war memorial. The last of their three sons Frederick Richard Relph also fought in the Royal Garrison Artillery, although he survived the war he also died in 1918.

February 2 - Saturday 10.30am - Speaker at Dartford The Inns of Court

The Inns of Court form the heart of legal London.

Guest Speaker Ian Bevan said: "This is one of my most popular talks probably because people think of it as a secret part of London. The Inns are guarded by large gates and look as though they should be private, but anyone can wander round.

Many of the buildings were originally constructed in the 15th century. The Temple, for example, owes its existence to the Knights Templar who occupied the site for two centuries.

A lot of the buildings were destroyed or badly damaged by the Fire of London in 1666 or more recently in the London Blitz. The Inns have, however, been sensitively restored, so much so that it is often difficult to distinguish the new from the old.

All of the Inns have five features in common, namely a library, a treasury, a chapel, a hall and gardens."

Guest speaker John Halligan**

John Halligan, an accredited City of London Guide, will take us on a fascinating journey through the ever-changing culture of the area, from Roman times to the present day.

**March 2 - Saturday 10.30am - Speaker at Dartford
The Siren Sea - Nations depend on it
Guest Speaker Imogen Corrigan**

The ship is one of the most common images found in medieval churches and manuscripts and not just on the coast, but often far inland as well. Nations depend on the sea for nourishment, safety and wealth but, all too often, it brings ruin and death. It was ever thus.

In this talk the life of the medieval mariner will be brought to life with his hopes, fears and superstitions. We'll also look at some spectacular ship-wrecks, some of which changed the course of history, and see how they fought to save their ships and cargo. We'll learn how they built ships and think about how they navigated: extraordinary journeys were made in a time when no one was completely confident that they wouldn't simply sail off the edge of the world or into the mouths of dragons. No wonder those returning to safe harbour were so full of tall tales.

'The Bodyguard' - life as a Royal Protection Officer
Guest Speaker Richard Griffin

Richard started his police career at the age of 16 when he joined Gwent Constabulary. During his three years with them he also pursued his love of sport by being active in soccer, rugby, cricket and bowls. He also took on the Duke of Edinburgh challenge and reached the Gold Standard; one of his tasks was to train to be a football referee.

At the age of 19 he left quiet Wales and joined the Metropolitan Police Force in 1970.

Richard was promoted to inspector in 1981 when he joined the six police officers sent in to reorganise security procedures at the Palace. This was the start of 32 years of further promotions in service to various members of the Royal Family, finishing up as "The Queen's Police Officer".

Richard comes to us highly recommended as being a highly engaging and amusing speaker.

Typing this up reminded me of a newspaper article I had read which stuck in my mind because it was so amusing:-

Mr Griffin recalled a time when the monarch was approached by a group of American tourists while on a walk near the Balmoral Estate in Aberdeenshire, according to The Times.

The group asked the Queen, who was wearing a headscarf and tweed coat, if she lived in the area, to which she responded simply by saying she had a house close-by.

"Have you ever met the Queen?" they asked.

"No," she apparently replied, before pointing at the policeman and adding: "But he has." The group were still none the wiser and left without realising whose company they had just shared.

The Peter Staple Heritage Group (PSHG) is reaching out to generate interest and encourage membership and participation in the Group.

The PSHG is a genetic family study supported by genealogy lineages for descendants and ancestors of Peter Staple (c1642-1719) Piscataqua Pioneer who arrived at Kittery, Yorke County, Massachusetts Bay Colony by 1671 (Now Eliot, York, County, Maine), according to his first found land grant.

PETER STAPLE and his wife Elizabeth BEADLE had three sons:

Peter Staple, Jr. (1670-1721), John Staple (1676-1745), James Staple (1678-1725)

The present goal of the PSHG is to use Y-DNA as a tool to locate cousins of the three sons of Peter Staple: Peter, Jr., John and James, including distant cousins in England, that will help identify the location of his English ancestral home.
