
Eg if my membership number is 1234 (it isn't!) I would type 1234EAMES as my User Name.

### **Useful Website Listing Protestant Martyrs in the 1550s**

Member Hilary Waters was watching a Lucy Worsley history TV programme, which mentioned the Lewes Bonfire Society and explained it was nothing to do with Guy Fawkes, but was to do with the protestants who were burnt at the stake by Queen Mary Tudor. These martyrs were mainly from south east England, many from our county of Kent.

Since 1858, five Lewes (in East Sussex), bonfire societies have annually remembered the martyrs horrific deaths during 1555–1557, known as the *Marian Persecutions*.

In the reign of her younger brother, Edward VI, Mary Tudor, daughter of Henry VIII and Katherine of Aragon, came under pressure to abandon her devout Catholic views. However, when she came to the throne in 1553, she had 288 Protestants burned for their "heretical" views – 17 of these martyrs were burned in Lewes.

Hilary told me about it because one of my possible ancestors, Stephen Gratwick, was listed as burnt at the end of May 1557. But maybe one of your ancestors or

surnames of interest was also unfortunate enough to be among them? Click here to see. <u>https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List\_of\_Protestant\_martyrs\_of\_the\_English\_Reformation</u>

The list is in chronological order, not alphabetical, so you will have to either scroll through, or search for specific surnames which interest you.

What amazes me is that transcripts of at least some of their trials are still on record nearly 500 years later: here is Stephen

Gratwick's <u>https://www.exclassics.com/foxe/foxe360.htm</u> Even though he may not be my ancestor (Gratwick is my maiden name but I've not researched that far back) I do feel a connection and that he should not be forgotten.
