THE TALK ON THE 10th JUNE 2023, TRACING MY ANCESTORS DURING LOCKDOWN. Clare Walker

When Clare set out to research her husband's ancestors, she never imagined the stories she would unearth & the many frustrating mysteries that would both enthral & frustrate her.

She also did not bargain on the shocks she would have to deliver to family: ancestors who were executed; murdered in their bed by a best friend; a missing RAF crewman; a doctor who has left his young wife and two small daughters to travel to Australia where he drowned: & a Gaiety girl who voyaged to South Africa with her wedding dress in her suitcase to marry a 'stage-door Johnny'.

NEW COLLECTIONS ON ANCESTRY & FIND MY PAST

Please remember that it is always useful to re-search ancestors regularly as new collections are always being added. During May the following have been added to Ancestry:

Hampshire, C of E Baptisms, Marriages & Burials, 1536 - 1812

Hampshire, C of E Burials, 1813 - 1921

East Sussex, Wills & Probate, 1518 - 1858

West Sussex, Wills & Probate, 5121 - 1858

Cupar, Fife, Scotland, WW2 Evacuation indexes, 1939 - 1945

Gwent, Wales, Electoral registers, 1832 - 1969

Two other new collections are 'Red Books of Scotland, 1600 - 1939' & 'UK & Ireland, Families of Historic Properties, 1222 - 1967'. Both of these could be of interest if you have Scottish or Irish ancestry.

There have also been a large number of collections which have been updated, for example:

Surrey, C of E, Baptisms, 1813 - 1921

Norfolk, C of E Births & Baptisms, 1813 - 1922

Norfolk, C of E Marriages & Banns, 1754 - 1938

Birmingham, C of E Baptisms, 1813 - 1922

And many more.

If you use Find My Past, new records for family historians with roots in North West England have recently been added. This is The Manchester Rate Book Collection to which 4.9 million records have been added in just 1 week! There are transcripts & images of the original records which cover the years 1790 - 1949. Rates can be likened to modern-day council taxes. Recorded yearly, rate books detailed the occupiers & owners of properties in Britain, along with the amount of tax (rates) that they paid.

Bridging the years between censuses, these records can help to fill in those gaps in your family tree. With addresses & names recorded, they can help you to place your ancestor in a certain place, at a certain time.
