THE TALK ON THE 8th JUNE 2024, POSTMAN\S PARK: THE ARMY POSTAL SERVICE IN WW1

Dr John Price

John is a social & cultural historian who takes a 'People's History' approach to nineteenth & twentieth-century British history & the history of London.

On the eve of war the Post Office not only handled a yearly total 5.9 billion items of post but was responsible for the nation's telegraph & telephone systems, as well as providing savings bank & other municipal facilities at thousands of branch post offices. Many of these services changed as a result of the First World War & the Post Office was crucial to both Britain's communications & war effort during this great conflict.

Carol Mellors

Carol trained as a teacher and for 20 years was responsible for Traveller Education in West Kent. She advised schools on the inclusion of Roma children newly arrived from Eastern Europe.

With her team she set up projects to link English Gypsies with their Roma cousins and trained Police, NHS and Social Service personnel in how to liaise with these communities.

Her talk will include the background of travellers and how to identify and research them. She will also cover New Age and Irish Travellers, Circus and Fairground folk who are separate ethnic groups.

A volunteer with good I T skills & knowledge of Microsoft Windows would be especially welcome as I am a Mac user & have not used Windows for over 15 years. With all the other tasks I do for the Society, not to mention commitments at home, I do not have the time or brain power to focus on learning it myself.

DNA MYSTERY SOLVED?

I hope everyone enjoyed last month's talk by Geoff Swinfield on DNA. A few days after his talk I took another look at my DNA results, especially the 'Through Lines' which track other people you are related to but not necessarily by direct decent. One of my great x 3 grandfathers was John who I know married a Mary, surname unknown. Both very common names for the time. He was from Bromley but the nearest Mary which roughly fitted time wise lived in Woolwich & had the surname Bowdon. I could not be certain she was my 3 x great grandmother.

On the 'Through Lines' I found 2 small DNA matches to 2 children from 2 of her other children siblings to William, my 2 x great-grandfather. With my current knowledge I feel this is probably enough to say she was my ancestor. Another mystery solved, I hope.

NEW RECORDS TO SEARCH

There have been some recent updates & new record sets added to Ancestry which I know some of you will find interesting. New record sets include:

UK & US Blacksmiths & Related Trades Index, 1720 - 1940.

Uk Battle of Jutland Crew Lists, 1916.

England medieval Soldiers Database, 1368 - 1374.

In addition there have been updates to the 1939 Register & the Global Find a Grave Index for Burials at Sea & other Select Burial Locations, 1300 to present & the UK, Red Cross Volunteers during WW1, 1914 - 1918.

Find my Past have also added thousands of baptism, marriage & burial records from Kent, very useful to most of us. They span several location across the county back to 1558. Baptisms are from the parishes of Charlton, Greenwich, Hadlow, Ightham, Woolwich & more. The marriages & banns, more than 10,000 added, come from 4 Kent parishes & cover the years between 1558 - 1955. Unfortunately no further details are given regarding deaths & burials on the website.
