# Sevenoaks Branch September Talk: They Dared to be Doctors: the story of women who struggled to survive in a man's world with Toni Mount

The fascinating story of the first Victorian ladies to succeed in a man's world.

When Bristol born Elizabeth Blackwell decided she wanted to be a doctor, the universities in her adopted USA didn't want to know and in England Elizabeth Garrett faced a similar struggle. Despite endless rejection they went on to pioneer women's careers in the medical profession.

Toni is very well known to us, researches her talks impeccably, and knows her subject. She has very kindly stepped in the cover Peter Daniels at short notice who could not make this scheduled talk. Do not worry, he will give his talk on A History of Crayford's Famous Textile Printers in July of next year!

# **September's Zoom Talk:** Posted in the Past with speaker Helen Baggott Thursday 11 September 7.30pm

Based on the books *Posted in the Past* and *Posted in the Past – Second Delivery*, this illustrated talk reveals the true stories behind postcards sent in the early years of the 20th century.

Using genealogy, Helen has researched the families to reveal their stories. Illustrated by images of some of the postcards, this talk shares some of those stories.

A 10-year-old servant working for a laundress in 19th-century Bath; the man who helped keep the doors to Great Ormond Street Hospital open for more than 30 years; a soldier killed in the First World War – all connected by messages sent using the first real social media phenomenon of the 20th century.

Helen Baggott is an editor, speaker and writer from Dorset. Her most recent project is researching the stories behind postcards sent more than 100 years ago. So far, three collections have been published

as Posted in the Past; Posted in the Past – Second Delivery, and Posted in the Past – Hands Across the Sea.

She has written for regional magazines and national magazines including *Who Do You Think You Are?*; *Discover Your Ancestors*; *Picture Postcard Monthly*; *This England*, and *The Card Scene*, and has also contributed to *Family Tree Magazine*'s blog. Through her work she has been recognised by national newspapers as both a Postcard and Heirloom Detective.

Helen has been a speaker at a number of online genealogy shows and a guest speaker for the Society of Genealogists. Her talk on post cards opens aspects of family history not often considered, and helps develop new ideas for researching your family.

She is a member of the Alliance of Independent Authors and the Society of Authors.

#### 11.30 Ian Waller on 'Sold, Separated & Divorced'

Our morning speaker, Ian Waller, is a retired professional genealogist and highly respected teacher of family history. He is a Fellow of the Society of Genealogists and has written several books in their "My Ancestor" series. Most of our ancestors were married only once, until death, but we all have discovered individuals whose lives did not fit that pattern. At a time when relationships outside marriage were unacceptable, what did they do when their marriages

broke down and divorce was not an option? Ian will explain that there are records recording desertion, wife sales, separation and even divorce which needed an Act of Parliament.

- 2.15pm David Annal on 'Lying Bastards': Exploring the impact of illegitimacy on family history research. David Annal an experienced lecturer and author who has been involved in family history for over 40 years and was the principal family history specialist at The National Archives. He is a Fellow of the Society of Genealogists and now runs his own research business and has a YouTube channel. David will examine the social stigma that has been associated with illegitimacy until fairly recently and reveal how these unfortunate children and their parents went about concealing it in official documents; or, just being economical with the truth, forcing us to take their information with a pinch of salt.
