MORE MONEY NEWS

In the last few months Janet has been asking for a donation of at least £2 per person at the Dartford meetings & your are probably wondering why. For every meeting the Dartford Branch has to pay £175 for the rental of the hall & on top of this there are the fees for the speakers which range from about £70 - £120 per meeting. In total this means that the Society has to subsidise each meeting up to the tune of £300 or more, or £3,600 every year! This is not a sustainable situation for the long term.

The Sevenoaks Branch is in a similar position but is better off as the rental for their room at Otford is considerably less than ours here.

On top of this the Society membership has dropped by about 30% since Covid which means annual fees are down too but the Society is still having to pay for other services, the Library & the journal for example.

So what can you do about it?

- ▶ Please remember to donate at least £2 per person every time you attend a meeting.
- ▶ Please consider making an annual donation through your Standing Order.
- ▶ Please encourage your family & friends to join the Society if they regularly come to the meetings as guests (visitors).
- ▶ If you receive our journal as the paper version please consider changing to the electronic version as this will cut down on printing & postage costs.

The Society fees have not changed in over 15 years despite the levels of inflation we have seen. Our annual fees are at the lowest level of other similar societies & will eventually have to increase but for the time being the Society Committee is investigating creative ways to attract more income.
