John Rayment will tell us about the history of the Thames Barges, whose red sails were once a common sight on the London River & Thames Estuary, & of the men who worked on them.

John is a member of the Thames Sailing Barge Trust, a charity whose volunteers have undertaken to preserve these vessels for future generations. You may have seen the results of their endeavours at events on the river such as the Gravesend Festival.

THE TALK ON THE 10th JANUARY, IS ISLANDS OF THE MEDWAY

Using animation, sound & images, this PowerPoint presentation draws on many sources; census records, photos, Victorian technical plans, personal experience & several trips to the National Archives - to bring to life the people who lived on these islands, unlock the secret of how the twin forts of Hoo & Darnet were built. There is also the story of the pub which stood on an island in the middle of the estuary, how a WW1 German submarine ended up where it is now & the story of the infamous Deadmans island. The presentation also takes a close look at some of the flora & fauna of this huge, beautiful wilderness that is the Medway estuary.

Adam is a keen canoeist with fifteen years' experience of paddling a fourteen-foot, Canadian (open) canoe. He has canoed in many places including the dramatic wilds of Ontario, pristine lakes of Finland, stunning rivers of Sweden & beautiful places here in the UK, but it is the islands & salt marshes of the Medway estuary where his heart is.

THE TALK ON THE 7th FEBRUARY AT THE DARTFORD MEETING IS FAMILY HISTORY RESEARCH AT THE METROPOLITAN POLICE MUSEUM

The Metropolitan Police Museum is in Sidcup & holds archives, books, photographs, equipment, uniforms & other artefacts relating to the history of the Metropolitan Police since its inception in 1829.

If you have a police officer in your family tree the Museum has Police Orders (day-to-day updates) on joiners & leavers, promotions and dismissals & rewards and punishments.

The Curator & Archivist, Clare Smith, will explain how the museum collection can be used in your research.

ANCESTRY - WHAT'S NEW

Do you have Family History in Hampshire? If so you may be interested in 2 new & updated record collections regarding Cemetery Registers, 1840 - 1923 & Wills & probate 1398 - 1858. Yes!, 1398! That's not a typo. And remember that the Isle of Wight is included in some.

Or if you have postal workers then Ancestry have added 2 updated collections, UK, Royal Mail Pension & Gratuity Records, 1834 - 1970 & UK Postal Establishment Books, 1691 - 1979.

Another new collection is the London, England, University College London Student Records 1828 - 1954.
